"My talk and image presentation is titled THE STORY ONLY I CAN TELL. Autobiographical, it tells of growing up Chinese in a predominantly Anglo-Australian culture in North Queensland in the forties and fifties. I identified with being Australian, and my Chinese side was suppressed. I came to Sydney in the late sixties. I got caught up with the Gay Liberation movement and I was able to come out as a gay man. This politicised me. About twelve years after that I came out as a Chinese - I claimed my Chinese heritage, and this became an important theme in my work. Many of the images I present are of the works I have made using text about these cross cultural themes, about looking Chinese but identifying with being Australian."
